 - If you enrolled and paid for 6 sessions or 24 weeks of study (120 class days of financial obligation), you could withdraw and receive a prorated refund through the 3.6 sessions or 14.4 weeks of study (72 class days of financial obligation). After you attended more than 60.0% of your financial obligation, there would be no refund available (72 ÷ 120 = 60.8% which is over 60.0% of period of financial obligation).
 - If after your original 6-sessions you extended your studies for 1 additional session and paid tuition for 4 weeks (20 class days of financial obligation), you could withdraw and receive a prorated refund through the 12th class day of financial obligation. After the 13th class day, there would be no refund available (13 ÷ 20 = 65% which is over 60.0% of period of financial obligation).
- Refunds can only be paid to the person or company from whom the funds originated and in the form of the original payment.
 <u>Agency students</u>: should you shorten your period of enrollment or period of financial obligation, please also contact your agency.
- If the school cancels or discontinues a course or educational program in which you are enrolled before your start date, the school will make a full refund of all charges paid for that program. If the school cancels or discontinues a course or educational program in which you are enrolled after your start date, the school will make a full refund of all unused charges paid for that program.
